Subject: DC Overload Circuit A-18 Board

To increase reliability of transmitter, the following change should be implemented immediately.

On the "audio input and overload board" (A-18), lift the cathode side of CRl (where it joins CR2, CR3 and R31) off the board, connect a short insulated wire from lifted side of CRl to the positive side of Cl2.

The board should be removed from the transmitter when making change to prevent heat damage to printed circuit board strip.

After change is completed to test circuit, attach jumper wire from Fuse F-1 and momentarily touch the other end of jumper to positive side of CR1. Transmitter should shut down and DC overload indicator should light.

This change will cause the transmitter to trip off immediately in case of DC overload due to any serious component failure.

Subject: RF Module A-1 through A-13 Service Tip

Care must be taken to check out the entire RF module whenever the 3 amp fast flow fuse F-1 has been opened.

Follow the instructions in Table 605; pages 6-31 - 32 and 33 of the instruction book. Adhering to the step by step VOM (RXI Scale) procedures will indicate if the circuit is operational. Never return the module to service without following this check out procedure.

Subject: Service Tip - All Miniature Fuses

Hairline cracks have been known to develop in miniature fuses. Visual inspection for an open fuse is both difficult and unreliable. We feel it would be both faster and easier to use an ohmmeter to "ohm out" each fuse whenever a fuse failure is suspected in the transmitter.

Whenever a 70 or 140 volt fuse is in suspect of having failed, it is important to measure it with an ohmmeter. A failed fuse there will cause damage to the PA module transistors in that supply line.

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
